

## **Customer Name and Address (Subscriber) Queries by the VPD from 2011 – November 1, 2014**

Please find attached a spreadsheet that contains the totality of known subscriber requests made by the VPD for the time period requested. These results are broken them down by year and by telecom and by whether the request was made with or without a warrant. In relation to tracking down briefing notes, memos or policy documents with this information, there exist none of this type of documentation.

To ensure that the information provided is accurate, time was taken to review all the data available to prepare this spreadsheet.

The methodology for the collection of the numbers exists in the spreadsheet.

### **Part VI Intercepts**

These numbers are broken down by year, telecom and number of telephone lines intercepted. Not all of these interceptions were full Part VI interceptions within the meaning of *the Criminal Code*.

Many of these interceptions were One Party Consent interceptions. They are included because they fall under the ambit of Part VI of the Criminal Code, though the line intercepted belongs not to the target of an investigation, but an agent or undercover police officer.

### **Call Detail Records (CDRs)**

The only way to obtain Call Detail Records is by Production Order. The VPD has not tracked the number or type of Production Orders it has had judicially authorized, or the number and type of Production Order served. Given that the service of these Orders was not centralized, there is no way to provide this information.

The VPD has made the decision to centralize the service of Production Orders to the Covert Intercept Unit for the purposes of tracking this and other information. This will be implemented in January 2015.
